Ben Preusser, who left Dover College last summer, has had an early Christmas present – his Duke of Edinburgh Gold Award!

Ben's Gold is a fine achievement and Mr Cox, DofE Centre Manager, is very proud that Ben has received his reward. A special section that is just added to the Gold Award is to complete a residential week. This must be organised by the participant and the task is to stay somewhere you have not been before for a week. The young person has to join a group of people they do not know and work on a project for 5 days and 4 nights, including events in the evening. Even most adults would find this a daunting task but Ben, with great ingenuity, organised, from his home in Germany, to go canoeing with a group on the rivers of Sweden.

The trip went well but getting the evidence was another story. First, Ben knew only the first name of his Assessor, Daniel. Trying to track down "Daniel" was only one issue. Evidence is required to prove that the week went ahead. Unfortunately, the only person with a camera in the group managed to drop it in the river! The tour company, Zebra-Tours, then ceased trading and could not be contacted. This was followed by the Covid lockdown which meant that no-one was at work at the parent company to answer calls and emails anyway! However, all was well, finally, and Mr Cox was able to work with DofE HQ to resolve the authentication and evidence issues.

For Ben's other sections, he completed his Volunteering by spending a year as a School and House prefect. Mr Lee commented, "Ben mentored new pupils... and has become a key player in the college. He makes daily tours with parents, meets and greets our visitors and delivers chapel services and assemblies. He has developed his confidence with meeting new people and developed his communication skills – especially when dealing with adults." For his Physical, he worked on his fitness for a year and, for his Skills section, he spent six months of his own time improving his German so that he could sit an extra A Level. Ben completed his Expedition section with expeditions in the Brecon Beacons.
