I am delighted to report that thanks to the incredible generosity of **The Dover College Trust**, over the coming months the College will be embarking on an exciting new digital strategy to support learning. We are enormously grateful for the Trust's support for this vital initiative, which ensures this investment can proceed at this time and remain entirely separate from our day to day operating costs and therefore fee income. As you will be aware from the letter from the Chair of Governors, we are focusing our efforts on saving all possible costs in this period.

Over the next few weeks, on the back of the Trust's support, upgrades will be made to the College's IT infrastructure, including new Wi-Fi. More excitingly, next term all pupils from Prep 3 upwards will be issued with an iPad. This device will be fully provisioned with the apps necessary to support learning, both in lessons during the day and independently in boarding houses or at home. Reception to Prep 2 pupils will have access to an iPad whilst in school.

We all know what a transformational impact technology can have when used well. Through the provision of devices, which will be configured to only do what pupils need to support their learning, an enormously positive impact on learning and teaching will quickly be achieved.
