As, somewhat incredibly, the end of the school year comes into sight our thoughts are turning to how the final week of term will work. Whilst it feels a little too early for us to make any firm decisions about how major events will run - we await updates on the Government's roadmap for reopening society - please be reassured that we are currently working up plans. Given the restrictions on off-site activities throughout much of of the year, we are tentatively planning a week of Round Square related activity during the first week of July to help to address this. As you will be aware from the Prime Minister's update to the nation earlier this month, the regular use of rapid home test kits will remain part of our everyday lives for the time being.

As a school, we will continue to issue home test kits to all staff and Senior School pupils. However, anyone aged over 18 wishing to, is able to obtain home test kits by ordering them online or collecting them from a testing site. More details can be accessed here.

Dover College pupils are asked to test themselves every **THURSDAY** and **SUNDAY** evening.

Their result (positive, negative or void) must be reported in two places by 9AM the next day:

- 1. To the College, by completing the form which can be accessed <u>here</u>.
- 2. To the NHS, by completing the form which can be accessed here. They will, if they have not already done so, need to set up an account on the NHS site. The link above will walk them through the steps necessary to complete this.

Prep 5 and 6 pupils took to the skies with their learning in Design and Technology this week. After being taught about aerodynamics and aero-engineering in the classroom, they went on to build their own balsa wood planes. The Close provided the perfect setting for test flights! The first attempts at flying their planes saw varying levels of success. Whilst one managed an incredible flight of 10 metres from the point of launch, another somehow flew backwards to record a distance of minus 2 metres!

Next week the pupils will be researching boomerangs, a weapon used by some Aboriginal Australians for hunting, and will start crafting their own. We don't think the local kangaroo community will have anything to worry about!

Hearing Trent screaming out his grandparents' phone number after the screen had gone blank, Caden called them up, and Trent was rescued with only minor cuts and bruises.

"All of a sudden his phone goes kind of blank, you can see a little bit of light and you can just hear him yelling for help," Caden told WMUR-TV.



Over the Easter break we were delighted to take delivery of the iPads which will be issued to pupils in Prep 3 and above this term. Reception, Prep 1 and Prep 2 will now have exclusive use of the existing Prep School iPad fleet.

The Staff INSET day, last Friday, included sessions on digital learning with a focus on how new technologies can be integrated in the physical classroom.

On Monday morning, Prep 5 and 6 will have a session in the Eccleshall Lecture Theatre during which they will be issued with their iPad. Mr Flower, Assistant Head (Digital Learning), will speak to the pupils about their new devices and the IT Team will be on hand to assist in setting them up. A similar session will run for Fourth Form during Period 4 that day. These year groups will trial the iPads, so that any necessary tweaks or changes to the configuration can be made before devices are rolled out to other year groups.
