From the Headmaster



The International Cenre

Dover College was the first school in the UK to fomally create an International Department back in 1957.

Initially pupils came only from NATO countries, but now the College has representatives from across the globe. With about 20 different nationalities at any one time, lifelong friendships are easily formed and networking possibilities set in place. Pupils quickly become a part of the special community that is Dover College.

On arrival, you will have a test of your English so that we can put in place an individual programme of studies to help you improve your English quickly. Immersion in English and lessons with peer groups also helps older pupils prepare for IGCSE and IELTS examinations.

Our aim is to ensure that you have the language skills that you need to participate fully in both classes and co-curricular activities, ensuring that you can make the most of every minute at Dover College.



Activities Programme

Whilst your academic studies are very important, we also believe in the benefits of an excellent co-curricular programme. From Sport to Computing, Creative Arts to Manga, volunteering, fundraising and the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme, we provide a plethora of experiences to enrich our pupil's lives, cultivate new talents, and build upon existing passions and interests.

At Dover College, the pupils determine our offer. Our wideranging programme of activities, societies, events and trips will allow you to explore and enjoy different ways of living and learning. By involving you in our full enrichment programme, we hope that your enjoyment of school life is enhanced and your personal skills will develop.





Half a Term

Pupils are always welcome to join us for our shortest stay of half a term (approx. 5 weeks). The programme will ensure that you integrate into exciting classes as well as receiving English Language support.

For Shell & Remove (Years 7 & 8), you will study the following subjects:

- Maths, English & Science
- Humanities
- MFL (Modern Foreign Languages)
- Creative Subjects (Art, Drama, Music & Media Studies)
- Computing
- Sport

Alongside this, you will work towards the Dover College Certificate of English Language Level as well as plenty of enrichment opportunities.

In Third Form to Fifth Form (Years 9-11), you will take the core subjects of Maths, English & Science along with a choice of Humanities, Modern Foreign Languages, Creative Subjects, Computer Science and Sport. You will also have the option to obtain the Cambridge English Language Qualification.

Lower Sixth (Year 12) have access to a choice of 3 A Level or BTEC subjects.

One Term

With a one term stay (of around three months), you will have the chance to immerse yourself in life at Dover College.

Each term brings different opportunities, with a range of sports, activities and excursions. Our facilities include a first class Astroturf surface used for hockey, netball and tennis, a sports hall, a newly renovated functional fitness suite, squash court, fives court, four outdoor cricket nets, lawn tennis courts and a dance studio. Our Farthingloe sports ground boasts four excellent football and rugby pitches, and our Maxton cricket ground is one of the most picturesque in the county, with magnificent uninterrupted views of Dover Castle.

A Full Academic Year

Enrolling for a full acadmeic year will give you the opportunity to experience the highlights of all three terms at Dover College.

You will make great progress with your academic studies and English Language level. In addition, being fully immersed in our enrichment programme will give you the skills that will benefit you for life.

In Sixth Form, pupils study for the IELTS exam, which is required for entry into a UK university and is an internationally recognised qualification showing a level of proficiency in English. They attend extra Saturday sessions to help prepare them for this difficult exam. During the year pupils are also regularly tested within the ISC and goals are set to help them progress quickly in English. Overseas pupils also have the opportunity to attend lessons in their own language after school to prepare them for external exams such as IGCSE and A Level in those languages.

Every year we are delighted by the success of Dover College pupils in their GCSE, A Level or BTEC qualifications. Our value-added is excellent and we attribute this to the determination of our pupils, the dedication of our staff and the unique ethos and environment that Dover College offers.



Admissions

To process your application, we will need the following:

- A completed registration form
- A completed Better Place for Learning form
- Copies of your two most recent school reports
- A handwritten personal statement telling us about your academic interests, what you like doing in your free time, your ambitions for the future, etc.
- A copy of the photo page of your passport
- The registration fee of £100

Dover College is proudly non-selective, so we do not have entrance exams. The final part of our application process is an informal interview. This can be done via Zoom, but if you have the opportunity to travel to the UK, we would be delighted to organise a personal visit for you to the College.

Recent Inspection

Dover College was inspected in February 2024. The inspection took place over 2.5 days and during that time inspectors observed lessons, met with many pupils and a range of teaching and non-teaching staff as well as members of our governing body. Surveys were sent out to all parents, pupils and staff, and responses were analysed in detail by the inspectors.

The report underscores the quality of the provision at the College, as well as the nature of our care and work with pupils both within the classroom and beyond it.

Crucially, we are recognised as meeting all of the standards and regulations governing the running of an independent boarding school. We are compliant in all areas.
